

# Glenn wrestlers win RU tourney

It was all John Glenn in the eight-school Redford Union wrestling invitational.

The Westland Rocket crew won five first places in winning its third RU tourney in six years. Glenn finished with 103½ points, followed by Farmington with 82 and North Farmington with 68. Host RU and Plymouth Salem tied for the No. 4 spot with 46½ points each with

Thurston, Harrison, and Southfield bringing up the rear.

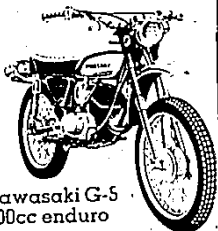

Now it's down to the fourth and final leg of the late closing pacing series at the Jackson-at-Northville meeting.

From all indications Saturday's pair of qualifying heats might be even better than the championship finale in just another week ... in fact the closing night of the current campaign.

Racing Secretary Tom Smith found 15 names in the entry box Wednesday and quickly divided the field into two divisions, eight going in the seventh race and seven in the eighth. Each mile dash is worth \$3,750.

This time Smith put all of the previous money winners of the series in the second division and non-winners in the first.

As a result he came up with a real scorcher in the eighth race.

The starters include: Blazer Chip, which has won the last two legs under the direc-

tion of Merritt Dokey; Tiger Jet, the Livonia-owned who shows one triumph and has been close in all other qualifiers; Ardens Rader, the relatively newcomer from Windsor who won by an astonishing seven lengths in his first appearance in the series; Kimber R. Range, victor two weeks back and then a complete flop last week; the fast-closing Ritzie Range, which is always dangerous; A Susan Knox and Knox Abbe.

And that constitutes perhaps the most outstanding group matched in the series. Every one of the seven is capable of taking it all on a given night.

This means there is a possibility of all seven horses, on the wire at the finish. It would be nice to see it happen but things never work out that way.

One has to believe Dokey, perhaps the best driver on

the grounds, has handled Blazer Chip so well that he made a top contender of a pacer that wasn't doing so well.

In typical Dokey fashion, Blazer Chip has come from behind in the final quarter of the last two legs and hit the wire well in front of his competition. The five-year-old, from the Frank Alexander stable of Howell, could make it three in a row.

The second division (No. 7 on the program) brings together the also-rans, horses that have raced in each of the three earlier legs and failed to finish with the top three.

The field includes: Fair Haven Hanna, Steve N.Z., Golden Major, Rocket Chip, Knight Desire, Daddy O Ranger, Royal Spectator and Chief Nugget.

From Florida rumors come that Jackson President and General Manager Leon A. Slavin will end his stay in Florida over the weekend and get back to Northville Downs for the final week of the meeting.

## Lathrup ties Churchill, 3-3
