North Farmington placed second best in both relays but made good use of three firsts, three seconds and six thirds to topple Redford Union and Livonia Churchill in a swim triangular.

The Plymouth entry reached the top in two divisions when he posted a 718 in the handicap singles and then took over the all-events leadership with a nine game count of 1702.

The Party Lounge team, of Cadillac, set the pace in the team event with an actual 2646, while the Pontiac Chiefs F.C.U. topped the handicap division with 2951.

In the doubles, Dave Campbell and Don Sapatka, of Cadillac, took the actual lead with 1125 and Rocky

Kundsch and Bill Harecourt, of Ferndale, topped the handicap session with 1261.

If Bill Spargo is going to be stopped in his bid to retain his title as the area's top average bowler, his rivals had better hurry up. He served notice last week that he will take a lot of beating when he came through with a closing game of 269 for a 731 in the Westland Classic. His closest rival was Leo Scantamburlo who had a 694 and Randy Randorff landed third with a 675.

Larry Brandt had a much easier time in the Garden Classic. He had a middle game of 278 and his resulting 723 gave him a bulge of 42 pins over Jim Hay who landed second with 681. Third place went to Bill Tapalian with 652 and Fred McClain finished fourth with 639.

In her bid to regain the honor of being the area's top woman bowler, Ann Setlock, day manager at Garden Lanes, took a big stride forward Wednesday night in the Ladies Major League. She put together games of 255, 215 and 210 for a 670. It was her highest series of the season and gave her a tight grip on first place in the averages.

When the last pin fell in the Businessmen's League at Bel-Aire Lanes, Aron Lippshay was out in front for the second consecutive week. This time he linked games of 201, 236 and 245 for a 682 and

a five pin edge on Joe Gresser who had a 236 in 677.

The big gun of the week at Bel-Aire, however, was Jack Dahlstrom who turned in his 716 series that included a middle game of 279.

One of the happiest bowlers in the area is Odette Yoder, a 145 average bowler at Farmington Lanes. Trying out a new ball in the Flanders PTA league, all she did was register a 245—the highest game of her career.

In the other ladies leagues, Sharna Du Fresno set the pace with a 209 in 563 in the Noon Classic while Jan Vanderwill took over second place with a 234 in 548. Dick Frank joined the ranks of the winners with a 231 in 622 to top the Classic.
