unit there was called 'Let's Have a Party.'"

Mrs. Henkel said her daughter is delighted that changes will be made to permit her to take shop.

Mrs. Shanks' report was that her sixth-grade daughter, Diane, came home from East Middle School in tears because she had been told she could not take shop.

"My husband used to be an industrial arts teacher and Diane is interested in mechanical things," she explained. "She wants to be an airline pilot and she will need some breaks."

Her mother decided to provide one with the protest to the school board, and while she was at it she checked the curriculum of another daughter, Dana, in the seventh grade.

She found out, she told the board, that girls in that grade are offered both industrial arts and home living but they are distributed on an unequal basis.

She made that part of her protest too.

Their documented arguments were supported by Lee Lavalli, state coordinator of NOW, Marcia Borowski of the Plymouth - Northville League of Women Voters, and Dr. Joseph McCleenan, Plymouth resident and member of the educational and clinical psychology department at Wayne State University.
