# Power struggle foreseen in recycling proposal

State Sen. Carl D. Pursell (R-Plymouth) said the purpose of the resource recovery bill, which he and three other senators introduced last October, is to work for recycling of solid wastes and [o] work for long-range goals such as developing byproducts of energy. Pursell spoke at an environmental conference held last Friday in the Observer Newspaper's board room. Senate Bill 1946, which was referred to the Conservation, Environment and Tourism Committee, would develop a state authority consisting of eight members in the environmental protection branch of the Department of Natural Resources.

esources. Pursell said local govern-ents would submit plans to ments would submit plans to this authority on what they are going to do with their trash. The function of the state authority is to oversee the whole area of solid waste recovery.
