

Power struggle foreseen in recycling proposal

State Sen. Carl D. Pursell (R-Plymouth) said the purpose of the resource recovery bill, which he and three other senators introduced last October, is to work for recycling of solid wastes and to work for long-range goals such as developing byproducts of energy.

Pursell spoke at an environmental conference held last Friday in the Observer Newspapers' boardroom.

Senate Bill 946, which was referred to the Conservation, Environment and Tourism Committee, would develop a state authority consisting of eight members in the environmental protection branch of the Department of Natural Resources.

Pursell said local governments would submit plans to this authority on what they are going to do with their trash. The function of the state authority is to oversee the whole area of solid waste recovery.

However, he added, "Whether we can enforce it on the local government remains to be seen."

Pursell said there will undoubtedly be a power struggle between the state and local governments.

"To influence land use matters," Rep. Joseph Forbes, (D-Oak Park) said that citizens should write their local officials. Rep. John F. Marks (D-Westland) added that one well-written letter on a subject can be just as valuable as 100 letters. He said it is important that a person show that he understands an issue.

Also, Rep. Raymond J. Smith (R-Ann Arbor) directed a project called "Super Sewer," which proposes to gather waste water from the Huron River and dump it into Lake Erie.

Smith called this project a product of archaic technology and said he would like to see the money spent more on elaborate treatment systems. Smith said that rather than putting quality water back into the Huron River, this project would just deprive it of some flow.

He said that the program cannot be justified economically either, that it would cost around \$300 million. In addition, Pursell said that a project in the Department of Natural Resources

to clean up Phoenix, Wilcox and Nemadji Lakes in Wayne County will be used as a demonstration project for the entire State of Michigan.

"We are going to demonstrate that we can make lakes that are unproductive useful," he said.

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Forbes doubts OK on land bill

A bill that would set up a state land use commission is "a sham," and one of its supporters doubts it will get the 56 necessary House votes to pass the Legislature this session.

State Rep. Joseph Forbes (D-Oak Park) spoke on House Bill 5055 last Friday at an environmental conference in the Observer Newspapers' building. Forbes' district includes the east portion of Southfield.

Forbes said the bill, which provides for a seven-member land use commission to deal with zoning and all forms of land use, is having trouble because of the power that was originally to go to the Land Use Commission.

However, because several local officials opposed the bill on the grounds that it would curtail their power, he said, that much of the compromising has been done and the wealth of power now rests with the local governments.

Also, Forbes said that each interest group brings in its own ideas and added several amendments.

In addition, Forbes said that three local governments of the Michigan Municipal League and the Michigan Township Association, two interest groups who have input in this bill, are not in support of it.

Despite these difficulties, Forbes is optimistic about getting the bill out of the Towns and Counties Committee and getting a good hearing.

He said there is no rush to get a bill passed this session, but added that there should be one by next session.

"It's necessary to have some kind of land use bill whether this session or not," he said.

Currently, there are two federal land use bills in Congress which Forbes said are progressing better than the Michigan bill.

"And it may be that we will get a federal land use bill before the Michigan bill is passed," he said.

House Bill 5055 was sponsored by Rep. Philip Martin (D-Haupp Harbor), chairman of the Towns and Counties Committee. The land use commission it would provide for would be appointed by the governor and housed in the Department of Natural Resources.

This commission would specifically compile a land use plan consisting of:

- a description of existing and future land uses;
- a designation of critical land areas;
- establishment of goals pertaining to lands where agricultural, forestry or mineral productivity should be encouraged or discouraged, lands where agricultural, forestry or mineral productivity should be reserved, lands which should be reserved for public use and lands where future growth should be encouraged.

Grant renewed

The Southfield 46th District Court Probation Department has received a second year \$54,435 state and federal grant for an improvement program.

Continuation of the grant was approved by the Office of Criminal Justice Programs. The city will contribute \$2,885 in matching funds.

State funds asked for drug fight

The Wayne County Board of Commissioners is seeking state funds to help finance planning of a comprehensive approach to drug and alcoholism problems through the new County Office of Substance Abuse Services.

The commissioners have authorized the new county office to apply for a \$15,000 grant from the Michigan Office of Substance Abuse Services.

Matched by \$15,000 in county funds, the money also would be used to provide staff services in the evaluation of the use of the controversial heroin substitute, methadone, in addiction treatment programs.

The Board of Commissioners recently appointed a committee of eight physicians and other professionals to conduct the methadone study.

In related action, the commissioners transferred a total of 10 drug and alcoholism programs from the Detroit Wayne County Community Mental Health Services, (Act 54) Board to the new County Office of Substance Abuse Services.

The County Board named Dr. Edward Leibson, former substance abuse chief for the state, as acting director of the new county office.
