Michigan's harness racing scene didn't change Monday even though the management shifted from Jackson - at Northville to that of Northville Downs under the direction of John Carls and his associates.

But one thing became clear immediately. Those who love to watch the pacers and trotters will have to be content with the conventional two-shaft sulkes for the remainder of the year. A vote of horsemen at the Downs showed little if any inclination to use the controversial single shafts and the problem was eliminated in a hurry.

Managements at Hazel Park and Wolverine Raceways have already indicated they want no part of the revolutionary single shafts which already have been barred in Canada by a vote of the horsemen.

North won the third quarter, 16-10, to carry a 40-36 advantage into the last eight minutes.

With 1:21 remaining, East tied it at 50-all and Fredericks hit a 12-footer to put North back up, 52-50 and 50 seconds left. East missed on a shot and in a scramble, John Creighton was fouled for North but missed on a one-and-one situation.

East handed in the rebound and Riley popped in a tying bucket and was fouled with 21 seconds showing on the clock. The East sophomore made good his charity toss to put East up for the first time.

North then had its opportunity with 21 seconds remain-

ing but then came the dribble off the foot and a bounce into the loss column.

Dennis McCrary's 12 grabs paced North to a 37-13 advantage on the boards. North travels to Thurston Friday and East hosts Franklin in Northwest loop action.
