

# New pastors arrive in area

**ST. INNOCENT ORTHODOX CATHOLIC CHURCH,**  
23300 W. Chicago, Redford Township, will celebrate the assignment of a new pastor, mark a seventh anniversary and serve a roast beef dinner to the community Sunday, Feb. 10.

The Rev. Vladimir Demshuk, assigned to St. Innocent by the Most Rev. Bishop Makary, comes to the local church after completing studies at Youngstown University, St. Vladimir Orthodox Theological Seminary and Iona College, both in New York, and Ohio State University.

Ordained last February, he assisted for a time in his

home parish in Masury, Ohio, and as a missionary priest in Michigan. He also has served in St. Benedict and Holy Dominion in Canton, Ohio, and in St. Andrew Orthodox Church in East Lansing.

The beef dinner, celebrating the church's establishment in this area seven years ago, will be served from 12 noon to 3 p.m. The cost will be \$3.50 for adults, \$2 for children five through 12, and no charge for children under five. Tickets may be purchased at the door.

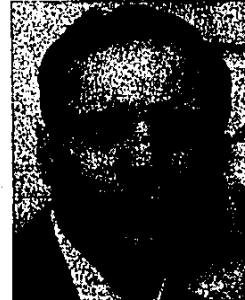
