Cancer Foundation needs drivers


If you are a licensed driver with a car, your help is needed to drive cancer patients from their homes to various hospitals and clinics for treatment. One of the free services the Michigan Cancer Foundation provides to cancer patients without transportation of their own is a ride to and from treatment centers. Many of these trips are from suburban areas to the downtown Detroit Medical Center, or to clinics and hospitals outside Detroit. The patients are self-sufficient except for their lack of transportation. Volunteer drivers may wait for the patient at the clinic or leave

the patient and come back when he has been treated. Currently in western Wayne County there are about 50 active volunteer drivers. With approximately 100 trips per month being provided, the cost of gas and threat of rationing, many drivers are needed. All patient driving is done in day time hours on weekdays only. Volunteer drivers are entitled to an income tax deduction of six cents per mile.
