Sisters to close Rosary High

The Adrian Dominican Sisters have decided to terminate operation of Rosary High School located in Detroit's northwest section in August 1974.

Announcement of the closure of the school was made by Sister Rosemary Ferguson, OP, prioress general of the Adrian Congregation.

"The decision to conclude 18 years of secondary education at Rosary is multi-faceted," she said. "A study of Rosary, its area and population, has revealed the lack of student population available in the area for student recruitment. The school is in

yearly operational deficit due to its enrollment decline, and the Adrian congregation is unable to provide future subsidy."

Rosary High, opened in 1956, has suffered a severe decrease in enrollment over the past six years. The enrollment has declined an average of 100 students per year to the present 466. The projected 1974-75 enrollment is approximately 330 students.

There are 11 other Catholic schools within close proximity, including Ladywood in Livonia and Our Lady of Mercy in Farmington.
