

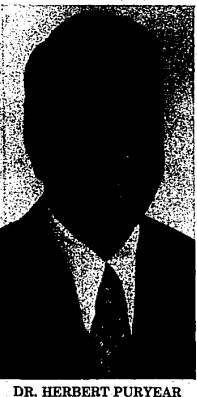


Sant Kesavadas preaches cosmic religion

Love brings unity his religion says

He sits in a sunlit room filled with flowers and talks of love uniting the world.
His purpose is to bring universal peace to the world through cosmic religion.
Sant Kesavadas was brought to this area by the Temple of Cosmic Religion of Southfield. Now on his eighth global tour he sees signs that his dream of world brotherhood is becoming a reality.
"Even in this place where so many murders and crimes take place more than 1000 people came to hear me. And we had 74 people take the initiation," he said.
Called the prophet of divine love and universal peace, Santji explains that he does not want to convert people from their own religion.
"I want them to be a good Christian, a good Jew or a good Buddhist. But the ecumenical spirit of love is growing. We have Catholics and Protestants worshipping together in our temples," he said.
Love born of wisdom solves the problem of humanity and unites the world in his message.
Most questioners ask about reincarnation, Karma, spiritual healing and love vibrations.
During the talks he said gains inspiration from flowers and al-

ways holds one throughout the lecture. Although he sings other than his own compositions he has made five records of chants.
His son accompanies him on the drums. Santji plays the harmonium.
He personally does not do fund raising and said that first class airline tickets, cars and food are provided by his followers.
Sant Kesavadas has directed his secretary Ramdas of the Southfield Temple to form a committee of six to build a permanent temple in this area.
"I will return in April to open it if they have been successful by then," he said.
Born in Bhadrigr, Mysore State near Bangalore, India he has earned a bachelor degree from Mahatma Gandhi Memorial College and a bachelor of law degree from Uplid Law College.
He has written more than 35 books and directed and performed the role of Sri Krishna in a play.
Sant Kesavadas is married and the father of three sons. His home is in India where he constantly tours the 45 temples of cosmic religion.
"I can't believe it is happening, we have no dogma. All worship together in their own way."

Sr. Aurelia joins Providence staff

Sister Aurelia has joined the staff of Providence Hospital this month as associate director of the Pastoral Care Department.
Born and reared in Milwaukee, Sister Aurelia earned her bachelor of science degree in nursing at Marillac College in St. Louis and a master's degree from the University of Detroit.
Her career has included assignments in surgical nursing at Hotel Dieu Hospital in New Orleans; as nursing supervisor and director of hospital director at St. Thomas Hospital, Nashville, and hospital education director at St. Joseph Hospital, Chicago.
She comes to Southfield after 2 1/2 years as director of hospital education at Providence in Mobile, Alabama.

To accomplish this, Sister Aurelia said the staff hopes to work more closely with clergymen of other faiths to help them become familiar with the hospital and its procedures.
"We aren't here just to talk religion," she said. "We have time to really listen, and this is often what people need the most."
She explained that during illness an individual "is faced with himself as a different person. Values change from a sick bed," and a hospital must care for the total person, including physical, emotional and spiritual life.
Another emphasis of the department will be directed toward hospital employees, who are invited to visit in the Pastoral Care Department.
