The Hills council Monday appointed two committees: a police review board and a personnel committee, to review the clerk's firing and the suspension of Li William Kelly, the officer who also attempted to report the shortage.

Mayor Robert McConnell named Margaret Schaeffer, Mrs. Joan Dudley, and William Ortman to the personnel committee, and Frederick Lichtman, Earl Opperhauser and Keith Deacon to the police review board.

Kelly is appealing his suspension, and Mrs. Roberts, is appealing her termination of employment.

The "violation of department to payment apparently a prelude to issuing warrants," according to Majoros.

The "violation of department rules" of both Kelly and Mrs. Roberts was apprently mainly going outside of channels to report the

"These questions of chain of command, confidentiality of an investigation, etc., will be answered by the hearing, City Manager George Majoros said.
