Rep. James E. Defebaugh (R-65) is part of a House group of four Republicans and four Democratis working on a stringent election reform bill passed unanimously in January by the Senate.

"It (the bill) will probably not go as far as I personally like it to but it will pass easily (in the House of Representatives)," Detbaugh said at the March 18 meeting of the West Boomfeld-Pontiac Republican Women's Club.

DEFEBAUGH SAID the bill would apply to all candidates seeking public office, including those "labor of love" candidates such as trustees and school board members who receive no full salary for their services.

There would be no limitations on the amount of individual contributions to a campaign or on the total amount of campaign expenditures, despite the protests of such groups as Common Cause and The League of Women Voters, Defebaugh added.

"Where I got my money is far more important than the total number of dollars I've spent," he said.

THERE ARE also several court rulings which have indicated that no limit expenditures may prove unconstitutional, Defebaugh said.

The filing of campaign expenditure reports with the county clerk and the state elections division would be a requirement for assuming that office.

Candidates also would be required to report "in kind" contributions, those favors extended to


