

OWC matmen win tourney

BLOOMFIELD HILLS—Olympic Wrestling Club (OWC) dominated its own Bloomfield Olympic Invitational Saturday by sweeping a solid team victory with 31 medalists.

"Obviously, I'm very proud of the showing our boys made against such tough competition," said tournament director Al Kebel, "but I'm even more impressed by the spirit of our club—wrestlers, coaches and especially parents. Without them we could never have attempted this ambitious project."

Nearly 300 boys five to 14 years old from Anchor Bay, Ann Arbor, Bloomfield Hills, Hazel Park, United Oaks, Hazel Park Webster and Rochester met at Andover High School in Bloomfield Hills for the nine hours of wrestling.

THE FIRST of OWC's 11 gold medals was taken home by the club's tiniest member—five-year-old, 40-pound David Gray. David

scored his first overall victory with a perfect five wins in five matches. Steve Olson, a 55-pounder, and Jack Bahm, a rookie 65-pounder, also recorded their initial first-place showings for the year.

Other gold medals in the 10 and under age division went to 46-pound Bobby Hastings, 49-pound Scott Issacson, 62-pound Andy Boddy, 65-pound David Segula, 75-pound Evrin Ergin and 60-pound Duke Wilson. Wilson's three wins on the day moved his overall record to 21-0.

IN THE 11-12 age division, two of OWC's most consistent wrestlers—75-pound John Segula and 80-pound Tom Barnes—captured first-place finishes.

Segula, second in the state tournament last year at 70-pounds, has placed first or second in every tourney this year. Barnes, OWC's only reigning state champion, has lost only one

match all season. Both veterans figure to be strong contenders this year in the overall Michigan competition April 6.

Rice senior diver ends 13th in state

Birmingham Brother Rice's Warriors closed their varsity swimming

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campaign last week with diver Joe Caverly placing 13th in the state prep swim finals.

Caverly, a senior, totaled 399.2 points during the festivities at the University of Michigan's Matt Mann Pool.

Rice Coach George O'Brien called Caverly one of the finest divers ever to compete in Detroit's Catholic League.

"JOE WILL be a good addition to any college diving program," O'Brien said.

"He has a grade point average of 3.9 out of a possible 4.0 so he can go to just about any college that he pleases."

Another Warrior diver, freshman Bart Connors, earlier was barely eliminated in the state regional qualifying round at Bloomfield Hills Laboratory.

RICE FINISHED its dual meet season 7-7 overall and 6-1 in Catholic League First Division competition.

The Warriors will be losing 11 tankers to graduation this spring. Besides Caverly, they include backstroke Mark Keating, breaststrokers Barry Lee and Pete Violassi plus butterflyer Jim Collins.

Other graduating seniors are distance freestylers Vince Burns and Bob MacLaughlin, along with sprinters Pete Doyle, Norm Droste and Paul Murphy.

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Jodi Yambor takes 2 events

Birmingham Swim Club's (BSC's) Jodi Yambor continues to sparkle on the competitive swimming circuit.

During the Michigan Amateur Athletic Union's recent women's swimming championships, she emerged as co-winner of the individual high-point trophy.

The championships, at hosting Birmingham Groves, drew top contestants from across the state. Garden City Swim Club took the team title.

Individually, Miss Yambor, a Farmington Our Lady of Mercy senior, paced the 100-yard butterfly (1:03.1)

and the 50-yard freestyle (1:25.0).

SHE ALSO finished runner-up in the 100-yard freestyle (1:56.6), while tying Garden City's Cindy Brown for high-point honors.

Miss Yambor now is preparing for the regional "Y" championships this weekend in East Lansing.

Her coaches are BSC's Curt Pfister and her father, Al Yambor, of the Birmingham Y.

Five BSC tankers were winners during the eight and under mini-meet competition recently at the Livonia Clarenceville Swim Club.

POSTING A new state target of 2:25.5 in the 200-yard freestyle relay were Dan Schryver, Keith Erickson, Robbie Kramer and Richard Kramer.

The same quartet headed two other relays, the 200-yard freestyle (1:04.9) and the 200-yard medley (2:53.1).

Teaming to take the 100-yard medley relay (1:16) were John Augspurger, Robbie Kramer, Keith Erickson and Dan Schryver.

Individually, Dan Schryver ended second in the 50- and 25- yard breaststrokes. Robbie Kramer checked in fourth in the 50- yard freestyle and sixth in the 100- yard individual medley.

Squaws win state tourney

The Southfield Squaws nipped the Dearborn Mavericks, 1-0, in double overtime last week to win the first Michigan Invitational Tournament for Girls last week at the Allen Park Arena.

Southfield's Roseanne Brunett broke a scoreless tie midway through the second seven-minute overtime in the championship final against Dearborn.

The shutout was the 25th in 41 outings for Squaw goalie Lori Zwirkowski.

The two-game knockout tournament included girls' teams from Ecorse, Inkster, Taylor, Westland, Melvindale, Fraser, Waterford and Allen Park. Southfield was 6-1 in tournament play, losing to Dearborn, 1-0, in another double overtime.

Although a first-year team, coach Dan O'Mara's Squaws raced to the Inter-city League title with a record of 12-1-3. Girls on the team are 13-15 years of age.

"It was a challenge for them, since they are a first-year team," O'Mara said. "But they put their minds to it and they really learned the game."

O'Mara is assisted by three parents: Mrs. Joan Kennedy, manager; Ray Brunett and Dr. Ted Swirkowski, both assistant coaches.

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
