Executive Glen Mingo Dies

Funeral services were held March 29 for Glen Mingo, 49, of 29331 Piper Lane, Farmington.

Mingo, chief financial officer of the Automobile Club of Michigan, died of a heart attack March 26 while playing

basketball at Beechview Elementary School in Farmington.

He was active in the International Youth for Understanding Student Exchange Program and housed eight foreign students at his house in recent years.

MINGO WAS an active member of the Shepherd King Lutheran Church, in West Bloomfield, serving as a member of the church council, Elder for Education and was a former Sunday school teacher. He also served on the executive board of the Clinton Valley Council of the Boy Scouts of America.

Joining the Insurance Exchange at the Auto Club in 1959 as an administrative assistant, he was named assistant treasurer in 1960 and treasurer in 1961.

He was a member of the Financial Analysts Society, the Greater Detroit Chamber of Commerce and the Kiwanis.

Surviving are his wife, Vera; three daughters, Mrs. Gloria McCracken, Julie and Barbara; three sons, Roger, Paul and Jack; three grandchildren; one brother and two sisters.

Dogpatch has been named the "most unnecessary town in the whole U.S.A." in the play, and has been selected as a nuclear weapons testing ground.

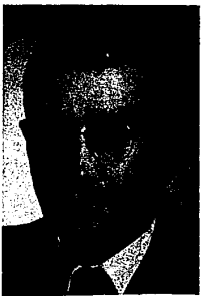
