The coin will be presented to Mrs. Briggs during the Million Dollar Michigan Lottery to be held at 9 a.m. May 16, at the Botsford Inn. Farmington Hills.
The coins were designed by Farmington High School student Lynne Dorando and Laura Herzog of Mercy High.

The coins will be made of sterling silver, bronze and nickel. They will be offered for sale, beginning April 16, through Farmington banks.

### Clarenceville adopts its preliminary budget

The Clarenceville board of educa-tion has adopted a \$4.3 million prelim-inary budget for the 1974 - 75 school year.

It exceeds anticipated revenue by \$32,000.

"The budget is based on the best we know as of now," said Supt. David McDowell, "and put together without a great deal of knowledge."


