# Prosecutor proposes drunk driver course

By SUSAN L. SILK Drunk drivers accounted for 47 percent of the fatal traffic accidents in Oakland County last year — a statistic which has prompted

the county prosecutor to begin development of a comprehensive driver rehabilitation program.

Within the next six weeks Prosecutor L Brooks Patterson hopes to have completed research and be able to announce implementation of an enforceable driver program to prevent future fatalities resulting from drinker's carelessness.

ing from drinker's carelessness. Patterson said there is a "crying need" for mandatory driver education, citing a recent report of the Traffic Improvement Association of Oakland County (TIA) that the occurrence of drinking in fatal accidents increased by nearly 22 percent last very cent last year.

PATTERSON declined to dis-

PATTERSON declined to discuss the structure of his proposed program but said he was considering delayed sentences for those found guilty of drunk driving but willing to take the course.

In February, 1973—shortly after taking office—Patterson's office initiated a policy of refusing to reduce the charge of those accused of driving under the influence of liquor (drivers registering 0.17 on the breathalyzer) or when there had been a prior offense involving alcohol on the driving record.

"We caused a lot more prosecu-tions but that in itself is not a preventive program," Patterson said.

PRESENTLY the prosecutor is studying the few programs already underway across the country, meeting with alcoholism authorities and interest groups. "We're going to have to find a way to identify those drivers who have a problem and get them help, and then find a way to avoid the same problems in the future," the prosecutor said.
