"Years ago, the Greyhound coaches did operate from downtown to Farmington, as well as from Redford to the Detroit Bank and Trust Co. location to Farmington, however they found the operation unprofitable and were forced to discontinue the service."

Additional bus routes are slated to begin this summer run by the Southeast Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA), but no schedules have been announced.

A commuter service leaving from Orchard Lake Rd. and 15 Mile direct to the Ford Motor complex in Dearborn is nearly full.

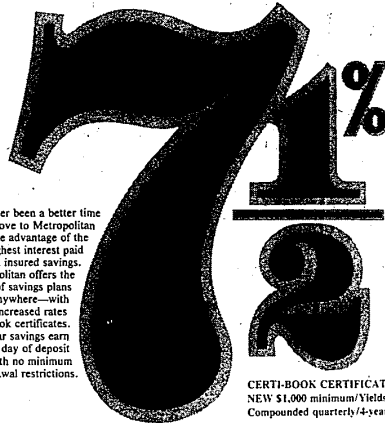
## OBITUARIES

Services were Wednesday at the Charles R. Sep Funeral Home with burial in Oakland Hills Cemetery in Novi.

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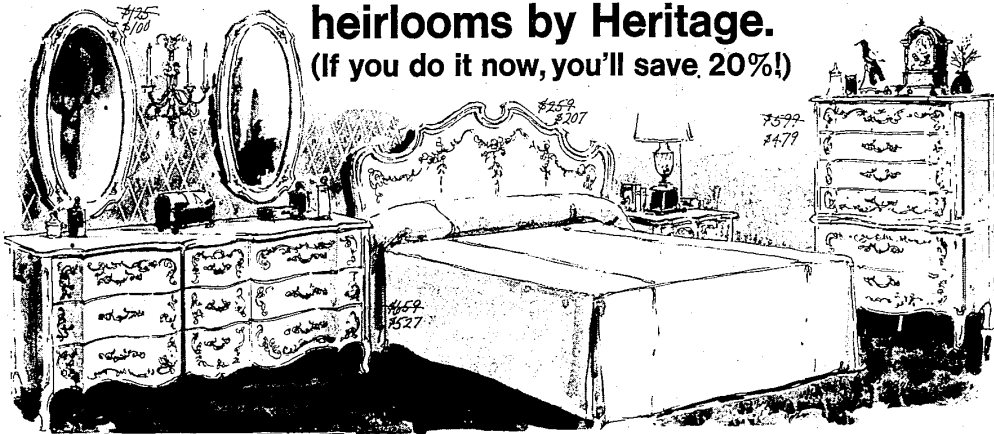
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
