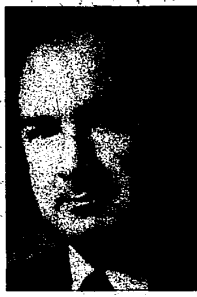


Patrick Sheridan named 'outstanding' Detroit Jaycee

Patrick M. Sheridan, 28, 501 Balmoral, was named Detroit's "outstanding young man of the year" by the Detroit Jaycees. Sheridan, treasurer of Hamilton International Corp. and executive vice president of finance of the firm's principal subsidiary, Alexander Hamilton Life Insurance, is a former president of the Michigan Jaycees and its Detroit Chapter. The award is presented annually by the Detroit Jaycees to a person 18 to 35 years of age working or living in Metropolitan Detroit, who has demonstrated concern for the welfare and advancement of the community. Sheridan served as the first chairman of Regional Citizens in 1973. Also in 1973, he was appointed a treasurer of the United States Jaycees, marking the first time a member of the Detroit Jaycees had held a national post. In this capacity, he is responsible for the \$3.5 million budget of the 320,000 man organization.

In recognition of his service and accomplishments, he was selected as one of the five "outstanding young men of Michigan" in 1973 by a statewide panel of distinguished judges. Sheridan is a member of the Board of Trustees of the Metropolitan Fund, Inc., the Board of Directors of Regional Citizens, the Southeast Michigan Jobs for Veterans Task Force, the SEMCOG Task Force on Urban Communications, the Advisory Board of the Economic Club of Detroit, the Notre Dame Club of Detroit, the Michigan Association of Certified Public Accountants and the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants.
