

'Rebel' clergyman to speak

Reverend Malcolm Boyd has often been called "a man for all religions."

The noted Christian spokesman, has been applauded, vilified and harassed.

He will present a timely talk on "A Christian Commitment to Israel's Survival: A Response to Father Berrigan" during the Jewish Community Center's Israel Independence Celebration, April 27, May 5.

REVEREND BOYD will speak at 8 p.m. on Wednesday, May 1, in the Aaron DeRoy Theatre, at the Jewish Community Center, 18100 Meyers Road, Detroit.

He is the author of more than 15 books, including the modern religious classic, "Are You Running With Me, Jesus?"

His latest book, "The Runner," has just been released by World Books, but it is his commitment to the brotherhood of Man, the idea that religions and people can coexist peacefully and productively that has earned him the highest of accolades.

Reverend Boyd has an impressive and consistent record of challenging bigotry wherever he encounters it, and of constantly speaking out against injustices.

HE RECENTLY denounced New Left Activist, Father Daniel Berrigan, for his attacks on Israel. Rev. Boyd charged Berrigan with "social and theological anti-Semitism."

The criticism stemmed from re-

cent remarks made by Berrigan to an Arab gathering.

Boyd accused Father Berrigan of "arrogance" and pointed out his "Compulsive need to hold the Jew in the mould of suffering."

"BERRIGAN seems to hold a curious image of Jews—that they are properly destined for wandering and suffering," Boyd said. "Christians have placed Jews on the rack and subjected them to the fire."

"What right have Christians now to demand Jewish conformity to a Christian-imposed image of continued pain, martyrdom or deprivation?"

In 1965, when Boyd published "Are you Running With Me, Jesus?" he was described as a "rebel who wears a clerical collar."

ALMOST 10 years later, after the assassinations, the riots, Vietnam and Watergate, it's difficult to believe that a man who asserts our right to freedom, our pursuit of happiness, who asks us to exemplify in action the morals we profess in words, is a rebel.

Rev. Boyd's lecture is open to the public and free of charge.

His lecture is being co-sponsored by the American Jewish Committee, American Jewish Congress, Detroit Chapter of Hadassah, Jewish National Fund, National Council of Jewish Women, and B'nai B'rith.
