Special Agent Joseph A. Clapp of the Treasury Department's Bureau of Alcohol. Tobacco and Firearms (AFT) has identified Walter A. Eisenberg as the man who shot him. Clapp described the government agents' raid on Eisenberg's Southfield apartment to an Oakland County Circuit Court jury and Judge Richard D. Kuhn Thursday. Eisenberg, 27, of 15700 Providence Drive, Southfield, has been charged in circuit court with assault with intentic commit murder for the alleged at tack on Clapp.

Clapp was shot as he, other ATF agents and Southfield police attempted to execute a search and arrest warrant at Eisenberg's apartment April 13, 1973.

WHEN CLAPP saw Eisenberg emerge from his bedroom armed with a 357 magnum, the special agent took partial cover behind the apartment's front dor. he said

Clapp demonstrated for the jury the crouched position he was in when he and Elsenberg exchanged fire.

Elsenberg was standing just outside his bedroom door, the right side of his body visible and his arm raised, Clapp testified.
