Bell asks rate hike

A nickel a day will be added to the basic charge for most residential telephone customers if Michigan Bell receives a requested rate increase.

Subscribers in Oakland County number 690,000.

Michigan Bell has stated rapidly rising costs, bargaining on new labor contracts and "poor carnings that are getting worse" are responsible for the rate hike.

David K, Easilck, Michigan Bell president, said the total increase being sought is \$111 million. He stressed the company would receive less than half, about \$53 million, after payment of \$58 million in additional federal and state taxes.

THE COMPANY'S application calls for increases in one-party residence service ranging from the proposed hike of \$1.30 a month in Detroit to \$1.85 in the smallest outstate exchange. The one-party residence service is the most widely subscribed to by telephone customers.


