IRVING W. ROZIAN, 48, of Plymouth, attended the World Energy Conference in Detroit and summarizes his impressions in this, the first of two articles. Known to the geheral public as a member of the State Boundary Commission, Rozian is president of Michigan Universities Consulting Service, a general conjuneering firm in Ann Arbor, and is an associate in the Plymouth-based management consulting firm of George Odiorne Associates.

THE MAJOR product carried away by participants is a consensus about progress made, problems to be faced and the most promising directions for their solution. Even more significant are lasting personal acquaintanceships among professional colleagues of diverse nations.

As the writer remarked to a Detroit arts group, most attendees at the energy conference were serious men, confident in their ability to deal rationally with human needs and the quality of the environment, but embattled of the environment of the utilimate cold of the second law of thermodynamics.

Each understood the short-term in-terests of his own nation, but he was also concerned that neither uncer-tainty nor unbridled competition should cause a breakdown of the international economic structure.

IN THE MINDS of the world's most authoritative energy experts, what is our human conditions. First, there is still a dangerous rate of rise of the human pobulation, particularly in Asia and South America. We are too successful—us\*a species.

However, there is encouraging evidence that birth rates can be brought under control without drastic measures. For example, a British spokesman stated that, mainly because of the

new practicality of voluntary birth control, projections of the population of Great Britain in their year 2009 have been cut 20 per cent. Second, the long-term energy resource picture is not bad, on a world basis. Natural gas is the most convenient fuel of the 20th century but has the least reserves. Its production will peak out in 10 to 20 years. Oil is the next most plentiful and convenient to transport and use. We have used less than one-quarter of known reserves, but without an alternative source for the bulk of our nearly needs, peak production may come before the end of the century, and reserves may be dissipated by the first quarter of the 21st century.

COAL IS FOUR or more times as plentiful as oil and can supply the bulk of human needs for a half-century to a century.

However, natural gas and oil have been so cheap and convenient that we abandoned much of our coal handling capacity 40 years ago. Coal can be burned cleanly in large central generating stations and industrial plants, but it is no longer acceptable for rail-tonobiles and airplanes, etc.

Many of us are rightfully concerned about the safety of nuclear power Participants in the conference stressed the need for environmentalists to be more quantitative about the capacity of chemical and thermal efficients. Realistic standards are needed.

So far, it was stated, the safety record of nuclear industry, having 15 years experience with between 50 and 100 reactors, is so good that your chance of being killed, directly or indirectly, by a reactor accident is thousands of times less than all other accidents combined. It is about the same as your chances of being killed by a meteor.

Further attention is needed to such things as the stability of fast-neutron breeder reactors, and security of fissionable or radioactive materials against terrorist activity.

NEVERTHELESS, it appears the human race has little hope for a comfortable and satisfying life without using fission atomic power as its maan energy source in the late 20th and early 21st centuries.

Reserves of uranium and thorium should be good for a couple of centuries, at least, if the breeder technique is used, or another method can be found to consume the more abundant isotopes.

Thermonuclear fusion promises unlimited energy from the deuterium in sea water, but there is no process vet, short of the hydrogen bomb, which comes anywhere near a net yield of energy.

Best estimates are that tusion cannot make a major contribution before the turn of the century. Furthermore, fusion is not completely free of radioactive waste, as some have thought. Escaping neutrons activate the materials of construction.

PREPARATIONS FOR the 1974 energy conference began with the ending of the last conference in Romania in 1971. The organizers and participants in these conferences are top-level scientists, engineers, executives and government officials in the fields of energy resources, energy conversion, and distribution of fuels and power.

Hence they were certainly aware that a 1974 conference would be a most timely forum to discuss growing human needs the pressure these needs place upon available reservand the ability of the environment to absorb waste heat and waste materials.

However, I think no one was aware of how timely and how stress-filled the 1974 conference would be, following less than a year after the decision of the oil-producing nations to form what amounts to a cartle and to use oil both as a political and economic weapon.

When the U.S. Netherlands and some other West European countries gave moral and military support to Israel in the Yom Kippur War, the oil producers (mostly Arab countries) irist cut off oil supplies, then restored them, but at three times the previous world price. Europe. Japan, and even the U.S. became suddenly aware how vulnerable they had become to foreign oil supply and how crucial the price of energy is to developed nations for economic stability and to developing nations for their hopes of a decent standard of living.
