

## C'ville, Plymouth top band festival

"Straight ones" was the order of the day for Plymouth and Clarenceville high school groups in the state finals of the Michigan Band and Orchestra Association festival last weekend.

Receiving the highest possible accolade from the panel of adjudicators, who based their scoring on both performance and sight reading, were Plymouth's concert band and Clarenceville's symphonic band in Class A and then both the Plymouth symphony band and symphony orchestra in the more advanced Class AA.

The competition was held at Plymouth, bands performing in Plymouth Salem High School and orchestras in West Middle School.

A "1" rating is considered "superior" and "2" is defined as "excellent." Among bands, performing,

Howell, Portage Central, Ypsilanti, Detroit Catholic Central, Westland and John Glenn, Lansing Waverly and Taylor Center received the "1" ratings.

Class AA orchestras, besides Plymouth, which gained superior ratings, were Grosse Pointe South, East Lansing, Grosse Pointe North and Portage Northern, Battle Creek, Lakeview and Jackson Parkside were judged excellent.

Okemos was the only Class A orchestra to win a "1" rating, while Hillsdale also gained that honor in Class B.

Both of the award-winning top-ranked Plymouth bands are under the direction of James S. Griffith, while Plymouth's orchestra conductor is H. Michael Endres. Clarenceville plays under the baton of John Neizek.

## Educators meet in Ann Arbor

Timothy Dyer, superintendent of Wayne-Westland School District, will give the keynote address at a conference of state educators and school administrators in Ann Arbor May 8-10.

The conference, sponsored by the Program for Educational Opportunity located in the University of Michigan school of education, is on "Teacher Training Institutions and the Need for Multicultural Education."

The event begins with registration at 5:30 p.m. Thursday, May 8, followed by a dinner and the speech by Dyer who is also a regent of Eastern Michigan University.

Beginning at 9:30 a.m. Friday, May 10, five speakers will discuss the need for multi-cultural education and the responsibility of teacher training institutions in this area.

The five are: Gwendolyn C. Jaker,

chairman of the multi-cultural program in the University of Michigan school of education; Eric Wilson, director of the office of student affairs, Michigan State University; Donald Peckenpaugh, superintendent of the Birmingham school district; Adella Arrando, Michigan Education Office of Minority Affairs; and Dr. Barbara Ort, supervisor and instructional specialist, Michigan Department of Education.

The speakers will be joined by two university student teachers, a law student and a supervising teacher for an afternoon panel discussion.

The conference sessions, in Win Schuler's, are open to the public without charge. Dinner and lunch reservations are limited and may be made in advance through the Program for Educational Opportunity, 1016 School of Education, Ann Arbor.
