

Groves, Lahser pull tennis upsets

Despite wet and windy weather, Bloomfield Hills Andover and West Bloomfield battled Monday for supremacy in the Wayne-Oakland League (WOL) varsity tennis derby.

Coach Keith Johnson's visiting Barons emerged victorious over Coach Greg Kopec's slipping Lakers, 4-1.

Andover now fashions a WOL record this spring of 5-0; West Bloomfield now is 3-1 in WOL activity.

On Tuesday, both teams received jolts in nonleague encounters.

THE VISITING Barons were bounced by crosstown Lahser, 5-2. The hosting Lakers were blanked by Southfield-Lathrup, 7-0.

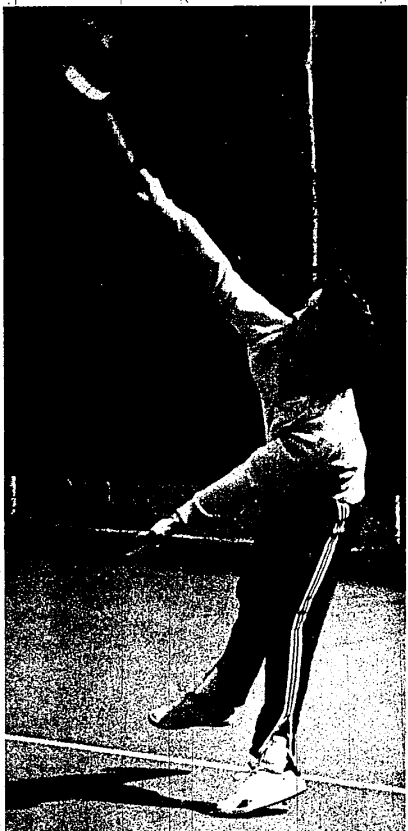
Country Day next will compete at 4 p.m. Thursday. The Yellow Jackets will host conference foe, Detroit Lutheran West.

Testing headlights for direction and illumination is part of regular safety inspection in 32 states and the District of Columbia. But whether it's required or not, it is important for you to have your headlights checked from time to time. Make sure headlights are adjusted while you have a full, normal load in the trunk and passenger section. Extra weight in the trunk pushes down the rear of the car and raises the headlight beams. Before making a trip have the headlights adjusted for the load you will carry.
