St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, Memphis, Tenn. is the only hospital devoted solely to basic and clinical research in catastrophic childhood diseases. It was founded by Danny Thomas in 1946 and dedicated in 1962. Since then the hospital has served directly more than 3,000 children from 31 states including Michigan and six foreign countries.

**THE HOSPITAL** is non-sectarian, interracial and completely free-of-charge to patients admitted by physician referral and if their disease is under study. "It doesn't matter if you can donate 10 cents or a thousand dollars, it's the thought behind the donation that counts," said Bozo. Deano Day added, "If we can help, we have to do all we can."
