

Missouri Synod topic of speech

Dr. J. A. O. Preus, president of the three-million plus Lutheran Church — Missouri Synod, will be speaking in the auditorium of Bloomfield Hills Lahser High School at 7:30 p.m. Friday.

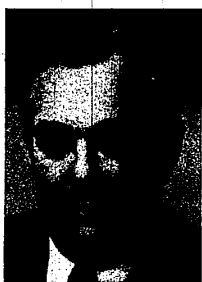
"What's Right with the Missouri Synod" will be his topic. An extended question-and-answer session will follow allowing individuals to focus discussion on the issues of their choice.

It is expected many will touch upon the "problems" and "charges" expressed recently by suspended Seminary President Dr. John Tietjen in his address at The Community House in Birmingham.

Dr. Preus will present the background and synodical position on the crucial issues responsible for so much of the described difficulty and unrest.

MODERATING THE meeting will be the Rev. Richard Schlecht, president of the Michigan District of the Lutheran Church — Missouri Synod. Lahser High School is located at 3456 Lahser Road, just north of Long Lake Road.

"The problems being discussed and which are causing so much anguish at our Concordia Seminary in St. Louis are not new," David A. Bradbury, recent past mayor of the City of Orchard Lake and a layman in the church, said.

"In years gone by, many pastors and entire congregations left the synod because of what they thought was the past president's reluctance to stand firm against the growth of liberal theological concepts being openly espoused by a number of seminary professors," he added.

"The moderate conservatives in our admittedly conservative Bible-believing church who remained did so in order to bring the issue of this changing theology up before a number of bi-annual national conventions in proper resolution form," Bradbury said.

Baseball, water sports, golf, fishing and tennis equipment; tents, sleeping bags, stoves, backpacks, lanterns and canoes; bicycles, swing sets, wagons and roller skates; chairs, tables and grills, and mowers, wheelbarrows, spreaders, rakes, sprinklers and shovels are among the items which will be received.

Forty percent of the sale price will go to the church and 60 percent to the owner.
