"If applied correctly, you can wear 15 different shades of makeup," she said, explaining that she frequently alternated from

dark skin tones to porcelain finishes.

According to Ms. Glanzer, women in their 30s exhibit the most resistance to makeup changes, felying instead on a previously established look.

According to Ms. Glanzer, She also advised avoiding too Gueent removal of nail lacquers. Try not to take the polish off every week, she said. "Polish over the polish."

"Older women come in and really want the help," she said. "Their skin is not as nice as it used to be."
