She said, "A great deal of things compel me, but I guess my teacher does the best job of it."

HER VOICE teacher, Ms. Jan Purdy said, "Lisa's capabilities are unlimited, she can go as far as she wants to go."

"I think she is best in opera, it is definitely her most capable field," added Purdy.

"I think a lot of Lisa, she has a tremendous amount of ability and talent. She is one of the most gifted pupils I have ever taught," Purdy concluded.


