Pat Miller, Michigan State basketball letterman in 1970-71-72, now serves his alma mater as assistant cage coach.

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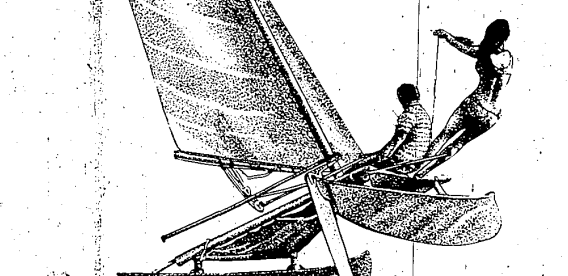
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
