

Tiger wives sell cookbook

Offered are Mrs. Jim Northrup's lemonade pie, Mrs. Norm Cash's wok-ed chicken with almonds, Mrs. Mickey Stanley's crab and shrimp mousse, Mrs. Dick Sharon's health muffins, Mrs. Eddy Brinkman's chocolate curl cake and Mrs. Joe Coleman's pizza fish.

Relief pitcher John Hiller, who bypassed the 1971 season due to a heart attack, has collected his favorite low-cholesterol dishes.

The cookbook, published by Edwards Brothers, Inc., Ann Arbor, is a fund-raising venture for the Team Mates.

Residences, a half-way house for the mentally retarded.

THE BOOK, which is dedicated to Tiger owners Rhea and John Fetzer, was a byproduct of a Tiger spring training session. Mrs. Don Lund, wife of the assistant athletic director of the University of Michigan, formerly the director of player personnel with the Tigers, teamed up with Mrs. Bill Freehan to mastermind the publishing venture.

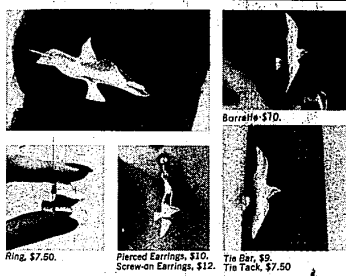
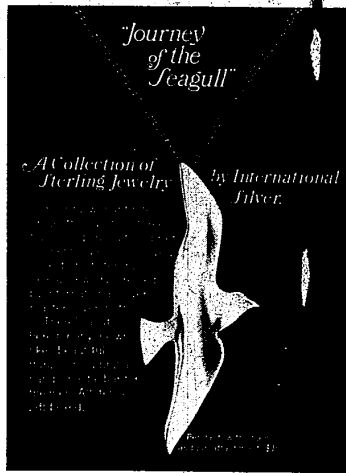

PAT FREEHAN'S FANCY PANCAKE

Preheat oven to 425.
 1/2 cup flour
 1/2 cup milk
 2 eggs
 Generous dash of nutmeg
 Beat batter with a fork. Batter will be lumpy. Place 1/8 stick of butter in an 11-inch skillet and melt in the oven. Add batter and bake 15-20 minutes until golden brown and puffy.

Sprinkle with lemon juice. Sift powdered sugar over it and serve with jams, jellies or marmalades. Serves one or two.
