Gordon supports millage

The Farmington School board needs a person who is a bit of an innovator...

Gordon said that his years as a newsman in the automotive field helped him develop some of the traits which are necessary to be such an innovator.

He said he is not afraid to try new ideas nor afraid to ask pertinent searching questions about new or existing policies.

GORDON SEES the role of the school board as an activist organization. He suggested that either the board as a whole or individual members should be available to the parents...

"The board should show greater concern about the promotions and transfers of school officials. I don't mean to suggest that it should attempt to run the schools but I think it should concern itself much more with personnel matters such as transfers and promotions."

HE ALSO SAID the board could be effective in instituting new courses or broadening the existing curriculums.

The board, he said, often spends too much time on minor matters. They attempt to thrash out their problems in public and often spend time going in circles without settling anything.

"Many of the things they spend a lot of time with can be disposed of much quicker or even done away with altogether. I think they should attempt to limit debate as much as possible."

GORDON SAID he does support and vote for the present millage but does not necessarily accept the proposed budget as handed down by the present board.

He thinks that the new board members should examine the budget carefully to be sure they feel the money was spent in the most judicious manner.

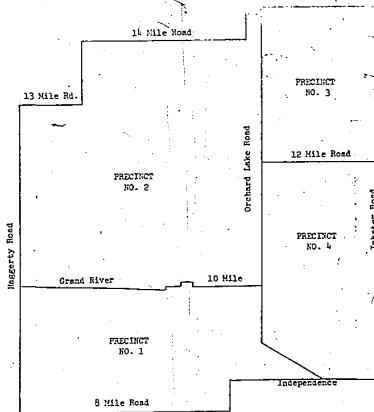
