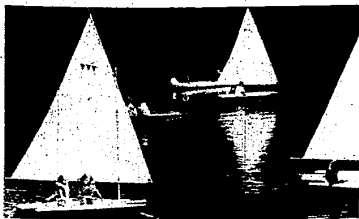

## Doctor arrested on drug charge

OAKLAND COUNTY—County Prosecutor L. Brooks Patterson has renewed his effort to close down the medical practice of an Oakland County doctor.

One month after seeking a restraining order banning Dr. Jesse Ketchum, 56, of 920 Long Lake Road, Bloomfield Hills, from continuing his Huntington Woods medical practice, Patterson issued two criminal warrants for the doctor's arrest.

Ketchum was arraigned at 9 a.m. Friday in the 44th District Court on charges that he obtained money under false pretenses and dispensed a narcotic without a license.

The first felony charge carries a maximum prison term of 10 years, the second a four-year maximum prison term.

Patterson said he brought the charges against Ketchum after receiving the second complaint in two weeks from women who charged that Ketchum had given them abortions when they were pregnant.

THE DRUG LAW violation came to Patterson's attention when he "heard that Ketchum had given one of the girls a prescription for a narcotic without having the necessary license."

Under the controlled substance statute, a doctor must have both a state and federal license to dispense narcotics.

On April 30, Patterson was granted a temporary restraining order banning Ketchum from practicing medicine by Oakland Circuit Court Presiding Judge Frederick C. Ziem.

In his 11-page complaint Patterson made reference to three criminal abortion charges and 10 malpractice suits that had been brought against Ketchum.

The abortion charges were prior to 1970 when the State Supreme Court ruled the anti-abortion statute unconstitutional and have since been thrown out of court.

MANY OF THE malpractice suits have also been disposed of, according to court records.

Also cited in Patterson's suit was Ketchum's October 1973 conviction of "criminal negligent homicide as a result of the abortion" performed in Ketchum's Buffalo, N.Y., office and the April 24, 1974, conviction in Detroit on the charge of "indecent and obscene conduct in a public place."

The prosecutor said Ketchum's "past and present professional and personal policies...constitute a hazard to the health, welfare and safety of the people of Oakland County."

On May 6, Ziem ruled to dismiss the temporary restraining order, allowing the state medical practices board in Lansing 60 days to complete its investigation and take action.

If no action is taken by the state board responsible for the licensing of physician's by July 6, Ziem said he would allow the parties to reappear in his court.

ON ISSUING THE warrants against Ketchum, Patterson said that his office would request an "extremely high bond"—\$1 million—in an effort to halt the doctor's activities.

At his arraignment, however, Ketchum was released on \$5,000 personal bond. A preliminary hearing on the charges has been scheduled for 9 a.m. Tuesday (June 11).

Patterson could not be reached for comment.

## Court sets sentencing for Tyner

The sentencing of a 24-year-old Troy man convicted of violating his Oakland County Circuit Court probation has been adjourned until June 21.

Howard Tyner pleaded guilty to the probation violation during a May 16 hearing held before Oakland County Circuit Court Judge Robert Webster.

Tyner was brought to court after Southfield police investigated his alleged use of drugs to lure teenagers into homosexual activities.

TYNER pleaded guilty to the delivery of cocaine in October, 1973. After serving 90 days in jail, he was placed on a three-year probation.

The conditions of that probation include not associating with known drug users and not using drugs himself. Tyner admitted before Webster.

Following a court-ordered psychiatric examination, Tyner could be sentenced to a term of four and a half to seven years in prison on the 1973 conviction, Webster said.

## Walks set for seniors

A program of nature walks is now being provided for Southfield's older citizens.

Willow Lippert, senior citizen coordinator, said the nature walks will be conducted twice a week in the wooded area behind the Southfield Civic Center, 26000 Evergreen Road.

The walks are from 10 a.m. to noon on Tuesdays and Thursdays for the next five weeks. Another program is scheduled to begin Sept. 17.

Ms. Lippert said the Tuesday walks would be conducted by Betty Challis, who is knowledgeable in bird identification.

The Thursday walks will be guided by Tom Jasina. His walks will include a study of flora and general nature, Ms. Lippert said.

Those wishing to go on the walks should meet outside the sports arena at the Civic Center by 10 a.m. Tuesday or Thursday.

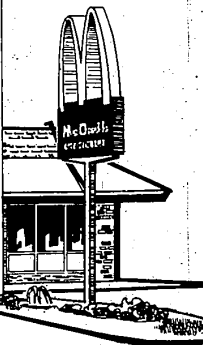
