Sewer cost going up

FARMINGTON HILLS — There has been a 12 percent increase in the original estimate of installing sewers in three Farmington Hills subdivisions.

Members of the Farmington Hills City Council were told by city clerk Floyd Cairns that the cost for sewers for Fleimig's Roseland Park, Tarabusi Roseland Gardens and Farmington Acres will cost \$819,200 rather than \$728,000, the original estimate.

The cost per unit foot increased from \$26.11 to \$29.68. Cairns said

FARMINGTON HILLS — A request by the Detroit Tennis and Squash Club, 31031 Drake Rd. for a liquor license was denied by the Farmington Hills City Council Monday.

A spokesman for the club said they wanted to sell beer and wine in their snack bar in an effort to make the snack bar self-sufficient.

A zoning variance was originally granted to the club when it wanted to locate in a residential area because it was a recreational organization.

Council member, Margaret Schaeffer said, "I am opposed to extending the zoning variance. We do not know what restrictions we can put on the club once they have been given the license. If we grant the right to serve liquor in one club we will have to give it to other recreational clubs too."

The motion was unanimously denied.

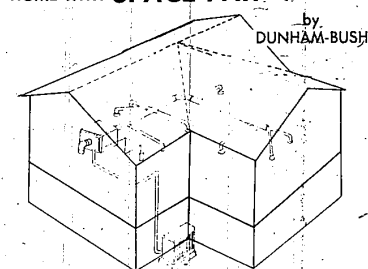

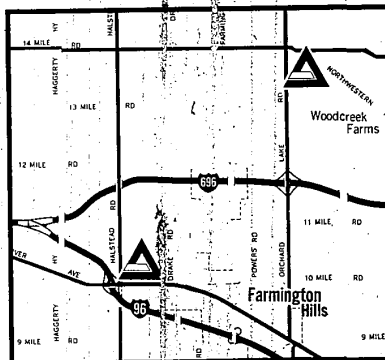
