Road paving to start soon

Work is scheduled to start soon on an Oakland County Road Commission project to resurface 2.7 miles of Long Lake Road.

The Board of County Road Commissioners awarded a \$55,683 contract to A — Asphalt Paving Company of Birmingham for construction of the project, according to Fraser W. Staman, vice chairman of the road unit.

Staman said two segments of Long Lake Road make up the resurfacing project: New blutonium overlay will be applied to the road from Orchard Lake to east of Middlebelt in West Bloomfield Township and from Lahser to just west of Vaughn Street in Bloomfield Hills.

The project is scheduled for completion about three weeks after construction begins, Staman said.
