Banks taking tax payments

FARMINGTON HILLS — Residents of Farmington Hills will now be able to make their city tax payments at local banks.

The Farmington City Council voted at its June 10 meeting to allow authorized depositories to collect taxes for the city.

City manager George Majors said residents will be able to pay their taxes at local branches of Manufacturers, Detroit Bank and Trust, National Bank of Detroit, Metropolitan National Bank of Farmington and Michigan National Bank.

"This will be more convenient for residents who do not want to be bothered bringing or mailing their check into city hall," Majors said.

"Residents can pay their taxes at the place where they normally do their banking."

The procedure for paying taxes to the banks will be the same as it has been in the past. Residents will be given two copies of their bills. They must bring in both copies of the bill whether they are paying at the banks or the city hall.

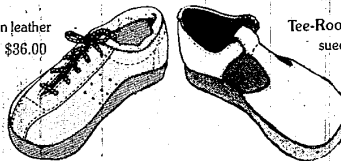
