ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE AND TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER

The Court having considered the Complaint of JAMES M. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that pending a Hearing on this Order to Show Cause and until the further Order of this Court, all persons interested in said corporation, including all stockholders and creditors, their agents and attorneys, and specifically defendant JOSEPH A. LUPTON, are hereby restrained from commencing or prosecuting any and all actions and proceedings of every kind and nature, in law or equity, against said corporation or its property and assets, from disposing of or secreting said assets, and from in any way interfering with or disturbing such property and assets or the Receiver appointed by this Court.
