"If you haven't done so, tell your survivors what benefits they might be entitled to in event of your death," the Veterans Administra-tion periodically reminds the na-tion's more than 29 million veter-

"Too often," they pointed out, "the veteran and his wife neglect to discuss the subject of death, resulting in unnecessary burden on durvivors in times of great emotional stress."

Rates rise on GI loans

There is now a higher interest rate on homes purchased with GI loans, but the alternative was in-creasing probability of unavaila-bility of financing at lower rates, the Veterans Administration said recently.
The maximum allowable inter-

The maximum allowable inter-est rate on mortgages was in-creased on May 13 from 8½ to 8¾, under a joint agreement by VA and the Department of Housing and Urban Development. "Had the maximum, interest rate remained at 8½ percent dur-ing the current market situation," VA officials explained, "veterans would have found it difficult, if not impossible, to obtain VA-backed loans from private lenders.

THE WETERAN'S family should be Sold of possible survivor's benefix such as VA's dependency and little minty compensation for service connected death, or nonservice connected death pensions for values, or just for children in cases where a widow may be ineligible because of excessive income.

Burial belights for wartime and certain peaketime veterans should not be ovel-looked. These include a maximum; \$250 burial allowance, plus a plo'riot exceeding \$150 for beterans 'fluired' outside national cemeteries'. In place of these benefits, there \$4.an \$8000 burial allowance for veterans who die of service-connected disabilities.

"VA officials, further stressed the importance of keeping track of GI insurance-policy numbers, claim numbers for inclusion in all correspondence wight VA, commercial insurance ipolicies, social security numbers and naturalization papers — all important in claiming various surivor benefits.

"And don't forget to turn to Voffices and veterans service organizations where assistance is available," VA officials advised.
