

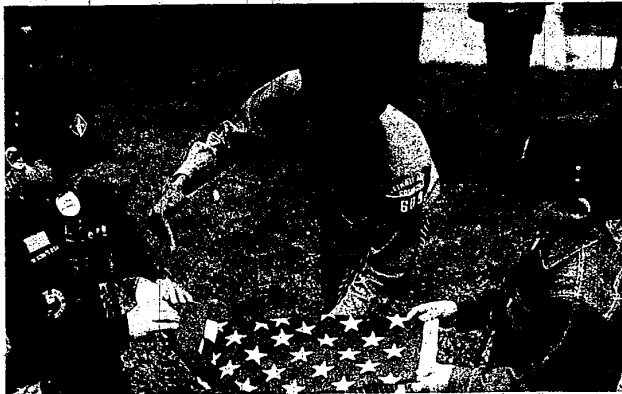
Cowden named to task force

Schoolcraft College Trustee Ron Cowden has been appointed to a state-wide task force of the Michigan Department of Education, and was elected as one of the group's two vice chairmen.

Cowden's appointment along with 11 others was announced by Dr. John W. Porter, superintendent of public instruction.

The task force will explore the practicability of the department of education initiating a major feasibility study on an external degree program.

Cowden was elected to a two-year term on the Schoolcraft board last June.

Dentist wins photo award

Dr. Samuel J. Prisk, 20269 Gillman, Livonia, snapped a picture of "people helping people" to win an award of excellence in the color category of the Kodak Community Service Photography Awards.

Prisk, who has been taking pictures 25 years will receive a \$100 cash prize, a certificate and an enlargement of his winning print.

THE CHALLENGE of this year's contest was to show an individual who is serving the community by helping other people.

Prisk pictured a boy scout teaching two cub scouts how to fold the flag.

"The scene took place at one of the two annual Webelos Day of the Detroit Area Council, 'Boy Scouts of America,'" explains Prisk.

"At Webelos Day, cubs are introduced to and taught many scout skills by older boys and volunteer lead-

ers to encourage the cubs and dads to continue in scouting. Included is a session on scout spirit incorporating care and respect of our flag."

Judges praised Prisk's photo, which they said conveyed the whole story of what scouting is all about.

PRISK IS a Goodfellow and involved in community service. He is chairman of Webelos Day and a member of the activities committee of the Detroit Area Council. He also is a member of the Clarenceville Board of Education.

Any non-professional photographer is eligible to enter the 1974-75 awards competition. The theme will again be people helping people.

Mrs. Dumas reports '73 income status

LIVONIA—Mary E. Dumas recently announced the amount and sources of her income for the last year in connection with her candidacy for reelection.

Mrs. Dumas, a Livonia resident who is seeking a second two-year term in the Wayne 19th District on the Wayne County Board of Commissioners, said she favors full financial disclosures by public officials.

She reported an income of \$15,361 for the last 12 months—\$12,180 from the county and \$3,171 from the publication business operated by her husband, Victor.

County commissioners receive a \$10,000 annual salary and are eligible for up to \$280 per month in \$30 payments for attendance at committee meetings.

"I support complete disclosure of sources and amounts of campaign funds, both contributions and expenditures for all candidates. In fact, I filed a complete list of donors of all amounts over \$5 when I ran for office two years ago and an itemized chronological list of all campaign costs," Mrs. Dumas said.
