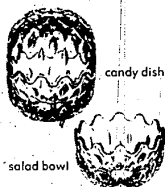

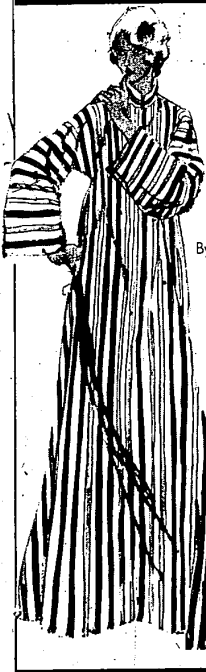

Volunteers

This column describing volunteer needs in Oakland County is co-sponsored by the Junior League of Birmingham and the Oakland County Volunteer Bureau, 642-7272. Requests for volunteer listing should also be made through the Volunteer Bureau.

CAMP FIRE GIRLS: Camp Fire Girls, Pontiac area council, 50 Wayne Street, Pontiac, has an immediate need for adult and teenage volunteers for their day camp. Adults may bring their own children over the age of two.

Volunteers will help with cooking, crafts and nature activities. On the job training will be provided. The hours are 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

NURSING HOME: Oak Hill Nursing Home, 34225 Grand River, Farmington, needs volunteers to work with elderly patients and handicapped young adults. Services are needed for arts and crafts, letter writing, hair setting or a friendly visit. Also needed are those with an interest in gardening who might continue indoor horticultural activities in the fall.

Volunteers may work between the hours of 10 a.m. and 7 p.m. with an individual or a group. On the job training is provided.

NEW HORIZONS: New Horizons of Oakland County, Inc. provides workshops for mentally retarded and multiple handicapped young adults at three locations: 117 Turk St., Pontiac, 36 E. Fourteen Mile, Madison Heights, and Westbrook School, Farmington.

Volunteers are needed to help

clients in various arts and crafts in the workshops. They are also needed for office work, client evaluation and transportation. A four-hour shift per week is required between the hours of 8 a.m. and 3 p.m. Help with special activities with flexible hours is also needed.

MCF to test cervical cancer

The Michigan Cancer Foundation (MCF) has been awarded a million-dollar sub-contract by the Michigan Department of Public Health to conduct a three-year cervical cancer screening program in "high-risk" population areas of Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties.

Goal is to provide free Pap tests for 25,000 women during the first year of service. First-year funding amounts to \$320,276.

Women considered to be "high-risk" include those who are medically under-served or medically indigent. Women who are reluctant or unable to obtain medical checkups and periodic Pap tests often are in lower socio-economic groups. The incidence of cervical cancer is highest in these groups.

QUALIFIED health care personnel will do the screening. Laboratory work will be performed at MCF's Meyer L. Prentiss Cancer Center headquarters in Detroit and at other facilities with laboratories licensed by the department of health.

Women who have positive tests (indicating pre-cancerous cells or presence of cancer) will be referred to physicians designated by the women themselves, or to outpatient community hospitals departments and to local health centers.

Jewish men treat Baptist children

The youngsters at Detroit Baptist Children's Home ate a steak dinner recently—thanks to the efforts of a Jewish men's group.

The kids have also received Christmas gifts from their Jewish benefactors, the members of the Maurice C. Zeiger Lodge of B'nai B'rith doesn't do too much outside of the Jewish community but we felt we should do more with others," said lodge president, Bernard Stahl, explaining the group's involvement with the Christian children. "We'd like to be known outside the Jewish community."

So the 450 members of the lodge treated the youngsters from the Royal Oak home to steak dinner at the Ponderosa Steak House. No limit was put on appetite and some of the children managed to consume a double dose of steak or salad or a triple serving of dessert.

"HOW MANY times are they

able to eat steak a year?" said Stahl. "There was no limit. They could eat anything."

The children, said Stahl, range in age from seven to upper teens, and many are mentally retarded or emotionally disturbed. Some come from broken homes. Others are unwanted or abused children.

"We try to help them as much as we can," said Stahl. "It goes back more than five years."

"They will send us a letter if they need anything and we will try to get it for them," he said, adding that the dinner was an annual outing.

Most of the lodge's fund-raising activities support B'nai B'rith youth organizations, such as the Hillel schools. But Stahl said plans are being made to toss Easter and Christmas parties for the children at the Baptist Home.
