19th Congressional race uncontested

Neither Republican William S. Broomfield nor Democrat George F. Montgomery face opposition for party nomination in the 19th Con-gressional race.

The district includes Birmingham, Bloomfield Hills, Beverly Hills, West Bloomfield, a western portion of Avon Township and many other more northerly areas.

The candiates were asked these questions:

1. What would you consider-grounds for the impeachment of President Richard M. Nixon?

2. List in order of priority your three most imperative legislative concerns. What would you do as a congressman to work for their enactment?

40, of 8690 Buffalo Drive, Commerce Township, is associate professor of political science at Oakland Community College. A graduate of Wayne State University, he is married and father of three daughters.

Montgomery, who also ran against Congressman Broomfield in 1972, served as state Representative from 1965-70 and as majority floor leader during 1969-70.

Montgomery's responses:

1. To believe the President's obstruction of justice (Watergate cover-op), flagrant abuse of power (IRS harassment of tenemies), and personal enrichment at tapayers expense (home improvements and income tax chiseling) constitution.

1. To restore public confidence in our government and political system.

2. To increase federal funding of education, allowing local school boards to reduce property taxes while providing a quality education for every child in every neight or work of the order of the control of the contr

"To bring more of our federal tax dollars back to the 19th district to help local communities provide sewers, roads, and other necessary facilities and services without forc-

ing ruin upon homeowners through exorbitant property taxes and special assessments."

Broomfield is married and has three daughters.


Before going to Washington, Broomfield served as state senator (1954-56) and as state representa-tive (1948-54).

Broomfield's responses:

1. 'Clear evidence of criminal wrongdoing, or refusal to obey a Supreme Court decision."

2. "Lowering inflation, halting forced school busing, and control-ling crime. Congress must begin to live within anticipated revenues, spending only on programs the na-tion can!-afford. The threat of forced school busing can only be ended by a Constitutional amend-ment which I am co-sponsoring.
