"You've got to face the hassel out there. You can retreat for a while, but it takes brains and determination to go base."

"Summer is usually a slow time for runaways," Barnes said. "A lot of them are out on the streets, moving from one friend's house the other. But it's hard for law enforcement officers to pick them up."

forcement officers to pica them. The kids at the Sanctuary are 12-17 years old and can stay a maximum of two weeks. Before they're even allowed to spend the night, parents are notified, said Barnes. "Some parents are relieved to know their kids are alive and safe and have a place to stay," he said. "Others are hurt and upset."

WHILE THE kids are at the Sanctuary, the staff provides family counseling. When the runaways leave, families are referred to other agencies.

"We use problem-solving techniques," Barnes explained. "We're not here to juidge to give orders, We're here to guide the kids so they can make decisions and
