He is survived by his wife, Lillian; a son, Michael; and a daughter, Susan.

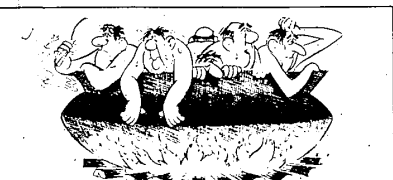

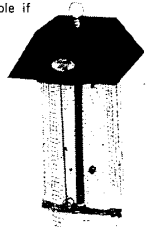

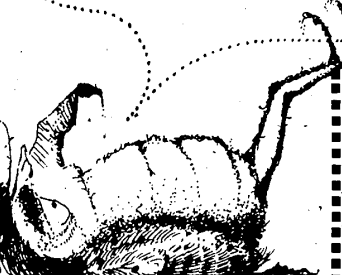
