

Recreation ends

The Farmington Area Recreation Commission's summer program comes to a close on Friday with a trip to Bob-Lo Island. Buses will load at all playground sites from 8:30-9 a.m.

Tickets are still available from counselors at the playgrounds. Participants are asked to bring a large size lunch.

The group will return on the 5 p.m. boat, and buses should arrive back at the playgrounds about 7:30 p.m.

The annual field day, sponsored by the FARC, was attended by more than 250 children, from the 10 playgrounds which participated in the festivities. A total of 212 prizes were awarded, the bulk of them donated by local merchants. Two mobile units, one for skating and the other for showing movies, came from an Oakland County agency.

The group reported that 159 youngsters attended the Tiger baseball game played on Aug. 3 and arranged through the FARC. The indoor gym program, part of the winter recreation program, is scheduled to begin the latter part of January at six school sites.
