Farmington may use federal job funds

FARMINGTON-Approximately \$17.000 in federal funds may be avail-able to the city of Farmington as part of a federal program which will en-able the community to hire previously unemployed residents as city workers. The Farmington City Council will re-view the Comprehensive Employment Training Act, CETA, at its Monday meeting, to determine which the the city will take part in the program. The Farmington City Council mets at 8 p.m. in the municapal building. Under the program the city would be required to hire previously unem-ployed residents, and to retain 50 per-cent of the people hired under the pro-gram for an additional year after the federal funds are discontinued.

The act does not stipulate what posi-tions the people must be hired to fill. City Manager Robert Deadman said he will recommend to the council that a portion of the funds be used to hire administrative assistant

The person hired for this position would handle personnel matters in the city, coordinate government programs and tunds and handle the bidding proc-ess for city purchases. IN OTHER ACTIONS, the council will consider seeking authorization to hold a bond sale for, the paying of Hawthorne, Power, and Prospect prads.

Hawthorne, Power, and Prospect roads. The bond sale would be for approx-imately \$111.000. The council will also determine whether or not it will open the bidding for a new fire truck for the city fire department. The city is considering purchasing a new pumper truck to replace the 1951 Peter Pirch truck is is currently using.
