

Orchard Lake widening is urged

FARMINGTON — The Farmington City council Monday urged widening Orchard Lake Rd. instead of merely resurfacing it.

The Oakland County Road Commission announced plans to put an asphalt overlay from Grand River to Shiawassee and from Shiawassee north to the 10 Mile intersection.

Also planned is resurfacing the road from 10 Mile to the expressway, 10 Mile from Orchard Lake east to Inkster, and Farmington Rd. north from 10 Mile to the expressway.

Councilman John Allen urged the adoption of a resolution asking the road be widened as well as resurfaced.

"I am afraid this will be used as an excuse for not widening the road for another 20 years," he said.

The resolution was adopted unanimously.

In other action, the council:

- Tabled a request for a free-standing sign on Farmington Rd. pending a court ruling on a similar case.

- Denied permission to use a single family home at 33614 Grand River for a small business.

- Approved a request for an antique sale outside at Lucy's Oldies but Goodies, 33335 Grand River.

City to hire with Federal assistance

FARMINGTON — The City of Farmington approved hiring a new employee under a new Federal program who will work in the area of personnel, purchasing and federal grants coordination.

The new program allocated approximately \$17,000 to the city. A salary of \$10,000 is anticipated for the new man, and the remainder will go towards continuation of the employment of another man whose salary is currently being funded by the phased-out Public Employment Program.

64th candidate says finances will be public

FARMINGTON — John Campbell, Democratic candidate for state representative in the 64th district, has expressed willingness to disclose all of his assets and sources of income.

The invitation for an open statement of assets and financial commitments was made at a coffee gathering, Aug. 9 at the home of Edward McGregor, 31772 Folkstone, Farmington.

"I have no outside interests or commitments that would conflict with the holding of public office and hope that at both the federal and state level we have additional legislation to correct some of the abuses now prevalent," he said.

Campbell also reiterated his pledge that if elected he would attempt to maintain a schedule of hours during which he would be in the district and available to residents for consultation.

Campbell, who is head of the social studies department at Detroit Country Day School, was also the Democratic nominee for state representative in the 1972 general election.

The 64th district includes the cities of Farmington, Farmington Hills and the southwestern third of Southfield.
