

County race cost is listed

FARMINGTON—The successful Republican candidate in the 27th District race for Oakland County Commissioner spent more than four times as much on his campaign as the successful Democratic candidate during the primary.

John J. McDonald, who won the Republican nomination, has already spent over \$800 on his campaign. In addition to the \$800, his expense statement indicates that he owes over \$300 to Faintuck, Swedel, Roether, Wolfram and McDonald.

The majority of his campaign expenses were spent on newspaper advertisements, duplicating service and for a party.

McDonald has paid for more than half of his expenses himself.

GERALD FARRELL, the successful Democratic candidate spent \$181, primarily for duplicating services and postage.

Although Farrell's expense report indicates that all his debts have been paid he did not list the individual contributors to his campaign.

The other two Democratic candidates, J. Andrew Ditzhazy and William Hatton have not filed their accounts with the Oakland county clerk's office yet.

The deadline for filing was Friday, Aug. 16.

Nancy Dittmar, who conducted the least expensive campaign, spent only \$112.

Out of that \$112, came the \$100 filing fee, which is paid to the Oakland county clerk's office.

Robert Smith conducted the most expensive campaign.

His expense report indicates that his campaign committee has spent over \$2,200 on the campaign and still had \$838 in debts.

All of his campaign expenses were paid for by the candidate himself or a member of his family.

August Barbarick spent \$564 on lawn signs, postage, and photographs. He did not list the individual contributors to his campaign.

THE REPUBLICAN and Democratic candidates in the 24th District were both running unopposed.

Lew L. Coy, the Republican candidate spent \$860 for his primary campaign.

Over \$300 in donations came from in-

dividual residents who made small contributions.

He did not state where the other \$500 came from.

William O'Brien, the Democratic candidate has spent \$6 for photographs.
