Although Farrell's expense report indicates that all his debts have been paid he did not list the individual contributors to his campaign.

The other: two Democratic candidates, J. Andrew Ditzhaya and William Hatton have not filed their accounts with the Oakland county clerks office yet.

The deadline for filing was Friday,

Nancy Dittmar, who conducted the least expensive campaign, spent only \$112.

Out of that \$112, came the \$100 fil-ing fee, which is paid to the Oakland county clerks office.

Robert Smith conducted the most ex-pensive campaign.

His expense report indicates that his campaign committee has spent over \$2,200 on the campaign and still had \$838 in debts.
