Village plans 'old car' days

As part of the varied activities at the 24th annual Old Car Festival on Sept. 7-8, Greenfield Village in Dearborn will take time out to honor some very special guests.

On Saturday, Sept. 7, the village will pay tribute to Eugene T. Gregorie, one of the nation's outstanding automotive stylists. Gregorie is credited with establishing the first real styling department at Ford Motor Co. He headed that department through 1948.

Gregorie is perhaps most famous for his design of the Lincoln Continental Mark I. His accomplishments also have included the styling of the 1933-37 small British Model Y (Dagenham) Ford, a design which was incorporated in the full-sized 1933 and 1934 Fords produced in the United States. Examples of these cars will be displayed in the center of the field throughout the festival.

During special ceremonies at the Old Car Festival, Mr. Gregorie will be recognized for his styling achievements and made an honorary member of the Antique Automobile Club of America.

On Sunday, Sept. 8, the village will honor Ford Motor Co. of Canada, Limited, for its continuing contributions to the automobile industry. The oldest existing and only independent manufacturer of automobiles in Canada, the company received its charter Aug. 17,

1904. Automobile production began on Oct. 10, 1904, at the Walkerville Wagon Co. plant in what is now Windsor. Roy F. Bennett, president of Ford of Canada, will accept the award.

THESE SPECIAL ceremonies are only a part of the action planned for this year's Old Car Festival. Each day's festivities begin at 12:30 p.m. with a parade of antique automobiles through the village streets to the Activities Field. There, these colorful relics of America's early motoring days

are judged for authenticity and excellence of restoration and vie for prizes in a series of races and contests.

The automobiles are not the whole show, however. One of the festival highlights is an appearance by the Wheelmen, a national organization devoted to keeping alive the heritage of American cycling. More than 80 members of the group, astride authentic antique high wheel bicycles, demonstrate the techniques — and perils — of maneuvering these unwieldy machines.

Later, the Canadian Model T Assembly Team will take to the field to transform a heap of component parts into an operating car and drive it away in a matter of minutes.

Also helping to recapture the excitement and fun of America's past are appropriately costumed hostesses, a Dixieland band and related special exhibits and crafts demonstrations.

There is no additional charge for the Old Car festival beyond the regular Greenfield Village admission.

'Mary Sunshine' continues

"Little Mary Sunshine," which closed Aug. 17 at Wayne State University's Studio Theatre, will be held over for a five week-end run in October and November, said Leonard Leone, theater director.

Performances will begin the weekend of Oct. 4 and 5 at 8:30 p.m. and will continue at 8:30 p.m. each Friday and Saturday through Nov. 2 in the Studio, downstairs at the Hilberry Theatre.

"Little Mary Sunshine" played a successful twenty-performance run during July and August, closing the University's Summer

Theatre Festival with its 9:30 p.m. performance Aug. 17.

In another development, the University Theatre has made a change in the Bonstelle Theatre's 1974-75 program, putting Brendan Behan's "The Hostage" in the final spot of the six-play series. "As You Like It" was previously announced as the closing production.

Complete seasons at the University's theaters now stand as follows:

Bonstelle — opens Oct. 18 with Aime Cesaire's "The Tragedy of King Christophe," followed by the

Gershwin musical "Oh, Kay," "One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest," "The Count of Monte Cristo," the musical "Purlie," and "The Hostage."

Hilberry — opens Oct. 18 with the revival of last season's "Tartuffe," followed by the new season opener, Pinero's "The Magistrate," and "Of Mice and Men." Robinson Jeffers' version of Euripides' "Medea," Peter Luke's "Hadrian VII," Anouilh's "The Waltz of the Toreadors" and, for school matinees only, "The Taming of the Shrew" and a revival of last season's "Hamlet."
