2 firemen hurt in smoky blaze

FARMINGTON HILLS—Volunteer firemen in Farmington Hills had between 45-50 men and seven pieces of equipment out Wednesday evening to fight a fire at a boat sales store on Grand River.

All four fire stations responded to the call at Boatland, 28400 Grand River.

Two of the firemen, Robert Boyd and William Yarbber were treated and released at Botsford General Hospital after sustaining minor injuries during the fire.

A spokesman for the fire department said it was apparently an electrical fire, but added that the investigation into the cause is not complete yet.

The firemen utilized seven vehicles to fight the fire.

Four pumps, two mini pumps, a rescue van, and the big aerial truck were used to fight the fire which was reported at 8:42 p.m.

The fire was reported to the Farmington Hills police by Mrs. Joan Gilbert, 21122 Waldron.

According to the police report the building suffered major damage as a result of the fire.
