



Blood will flow at Fall Festival

Although most of the young people who visit Youth, Inc. in Plymouth are too young to give blood, one of the activities the youth organization is sponsoring is the Red Cross bloodmobile during the Fall Festival.

Potential blood donors must be at least 17 years old and have parental approval if under 18.

"We wanted to do something that would serve the community, in addition to our fund-raising activities," a Youth, Inc. spokesperson said.

The organization will receive no money for sponsoring the bloodmobile. The Red Cross will have a trained staff on hand, while a local doctor will volunteer his services for

the two days the bloodmobile will be in the area.

This is the first time that a bloodmobile has been used in conjunction with the festival.

On Saturday the bloodmobile will be parked in front of Youth, Inc. from 1:30 until 7:30 p.m., and on Sunday from noon until 6 p.m. The youth center is located at 271 S. Main.

No festival is complete without food, and Youth, Inc. will be selling corned beef sandwiches and cole slaw, topped off with a soft drink during the four-day event.

In case people have need of additional funds, Youth, Inc. will sponsor contests on Friday and Saturday with two winners receiving \$100 each and a grand winner receiving \$300.

Mrs. Crosby is presently exhibiting her work at Robert Thom Gallery in Birmingham. Past exhibits include Cornell University, University of Michigan, Manchester College, University of Texas, University of North Dakota, Bowling Green State University, University of Delaware and Lawrence University.
